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The Articles of Confederation Opening to Lesson. Ask students: Why are rules needed in society? Body of Lesson. Ask students to name one rule in the classroom and why it is in effect. Closing. Ask students: Which rules in society today would you like to see changed and why?

The Articles of Confederation were written during the American Revolution. Ben Franklin wrote the first draft, but it did not pass because the colonists thought it gave too much power to a central government. After a great deal of discussion and correction, the articles were ratified (approved by vote) in 1781. The Articles were a compromise.

This system seemed fair, but made it difficult to pass laws and make decisions. To make matters worse, the Articles of Confederation also required that in order to pass a law, nine of the thirteen states had to agree.
