Proteus, an early sea-god, advised Peleus to find the sea nymph ...

Achilles : Achilles (Ἀχιλλεύς) was the son of Peleus and the Nereid Thetis. Ligyron was the name given to Achilles at birth. While still an infant, Thetis tried to make her son immortal. One account says that she anointed Achilles in ambrosia before laying him in a fire, burning away the mortal parts of his body, making him invulnerable from ordinary weapons.

Zeus was the brother of Hestia, Poseidon, Hades, Demeter and Hera. Zeus was the youngest among his siblings, though in The Iliad, Homer wrote Zeus claiming to be the eldest - as the "first-born".
